Descriptor

This qualification reflects the role of individuals in a range of community settings and peoples' homes, who provide support in a manner that empowers people with disabilities to achieve greater levels of independence, self-reliance, community participation and wellbeing. Workers promote a person-centred approach, work according to and may contribute to an individualised plan, and work without direct supervision. They may be required to supervise and/or coordinate a small team.

Mode of delivery

DOMESTIC STUDENTS

*# This course is delivered to domestic students in face-to-face classes of 20 hours per week, online, on-the-job or or mixed mode. Traineeships are also available.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

This course is delivered to international students @ 20 hours per week for 4 terms of 10 weeks each. Additional study is required to complete unsupervised, independent work in your own time.

OR

Completion of: CHC33015 Certificate III in Individual Support (Disability)

OR

Completion of: CHC30408 Certificate III in Disability **PLUS** the *CHCSS00125 Entry to Certificate IV in Disability Support Skill Set*.

Assessment

Assessment for this qualification is by written reports, case studies, role plays, written assessments and practical assessments in simulated environments as well as a designated workplace.

Recognition of Prior Learning

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) is available to all students applying for this qualification. Conditions apply. RPL is the recognition of your current skills and knowledge acquired through prior learning from other training, work or life experience. International students are advised that their student visa duration may be impacted if applying for and granted RPL.

Target Groups

Students who wish to work either caring for people with a disability at home or in a disability care facility under direct supervision.

International students must hold an approved student visa and study according to their visa conditions.
